WHAT SORTS OF THINGS DO SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS DO TO REVISE?

- Stick to a revision schedule. Plan which topics you aim to revise then tick off. Gradually introduce practice papers into independent revision.
- Complete the WTM's (Walking Talking Mocks) from lessons and attempt past papers independently online (set on MathsWatch by teachers).
- Watch MathsWatch tutorials, using with your PLC from parents evening to target revision to particular topics and using the interactive questions to check your understanding.
- Come to Maths clinic on Thursday afterschool in **T3**. Bring any questions that confuse you, whether that be from your classwork, homework or independent revision.
- Use Corbett Maths revision cards to revise individual topics and identify areas with which you need extra help.
- Use the Oxford 'Revise' revision guides in conjunction with revision workbooks.
- Learn formulas and exact trigonometry values (higher tier only).
- Get into a habit of showing all workings out, especially in the calculator paper and highlighting key information.
- Learn how to use your calculator.
